Matters Arising -

<u>161 Police Report</u> - this meeting followed a public meeting held in the Centenary Hall & attended by over 80 concerned residents, to address off-roading problem in the area. The meeting was addressed by Sgt 1842 Luke Hughes who assured those present that the matter was being taken seriously by North Wales Police. A further meeting will be arranged to include members of Wrexham Council & other interested organisations.

<u>162 Defibrillator</u> – The Llanarmon defibrillator is up & running at The Hand Hotel. Signs are still required. The defibrillator in Tregeiriog is ready to be installed, new batteries having been purchased. Cllr Benning, who is leading this project, is awaiting further information from SP Energy regarding a power supply for the bus stop.

<u>163 Finance/Bank -</u> A copy of the attached annual accounts (April 2019) was circulated for the Council to consider. It was agreed to reimburse Cllr Evans-Swogger for attending a planning course in Llangollen.

<u>164 Planning</u> - An application regarding an extension at Cwm Canol, Tyn Twyll road, has been received. Cllr R.Edwards recused himself & left the room. No comment regarding the application was made.

<u>165 Roads & Lighting - The problems regarding lighting in Tregeiriog have once again been reported to WCBC.</u>

166 Report from Committee Reps. - none

<u>167 A.O.B. -</u> Cllr Greatorex understood C.V.P had a meeting with Jo Bickerton of Visit Wrexham. He noted that their Tourism plan does very little to promote the Ceiriog Valley. Other Councillors commented that this was common throughout, not just Tourism. Cllr Benning noted that the cost of provision of education in the Ceiriog Valley was 3X that of WCBC as a whole.
